

Clay County Farm Bureau Teacher Mini-Grant Program



The Clay County Farm Bureau Teacher Mini-Grant program is designed to show students that the agriculture industry is an integral part of their lives as it provides food, fiber, and shelter for the United States and the world! It is also important for children to understand where their food and fiber comes from and develop an appreciation for the agriculture industry. Clay County Farm Bureau seeks to educate students about agricul-ture by partnering with their teachers to support classroom projects that integrate agriculture into the aca-demic curriculum. Therefore, Clay County Farm Bureau will provide a total of \$2,000 to Clay County School District teachers to support agriculture literacy programs. The maximum amount awarded to a teacher will be **\$200**. Checks will be made payable to the school. The deadline for applying is January 15, 2021. Award notifications will be sent by January 29, 2021. Applications can be dropped off at any Farm Bureau Office, Hendrys@bellsouth.net or sent in the county mail to Kelly Mosley, Career and Technical Education Specialist, at the CTE/ACE Building. Clay County Farm Bureau will plan an awards reception in February. If your project is awarded, you must complete a final report to be eligible for the 2021-2022 mini-grant program. Final reports are the last page of this packet and can be dropped off at any Farm Bureau Office, emailed to Hendrys@bellsouth.net or sent in the county mail to Kelly Mosley, Career and Technical Education Specialist by May 21, 2021.

Requirements

- ✓ Your project must integrate agriculture into your academic curriculum.
- ✓ Your project must directly involve students.
- ✓ Your goals and objectives must be clearly stated and measurable.
- ✓ Your must include a plan for project evaluation.
- ✓ The use of <u>Florida Agriculture in the Classroom, Inc.</u> materials and/or <u>American Farm Bureau's Founda-</u> <u>tion for Agriculture's Accurate Ag Book list</u> is strongly encouraged. You can access these resources by clicking on the hyperlinks listed above.
- Must be willing to allow Clay County Farm Bureau to use photographs and/or video of the project for promotional purposes. The Clay County Farm Bureau realizes provisions must be made to comply with school board policies regarding student privacy.
- ✓ You must complete the entire application and submit by the deadline. Do not attach pages. You are only limited to the space given in the application. Additional pages will not be judged.
