FEMA

FEMA operates several mobile sites to help residents file FEMA claims:

Dixie: Dixie Co. Public Library
Lafayette: Mayo Community Center

Suwannee: Ag. Coliseum

1 Document all damage to property, livestock, and equipment. Be sure to take photos and notes with dates and times as you're able.



2 Make a list of immediate needs, including power, feed or water, worker housing, etc. Please alert the State Ag. Response Team (SART) with FDACS immediately at flsart.org.



3 View the reverse of this sheet for information about FEMA, SBA, and other agencies' mobile sites to speak with a representative in-person if you need assistance filing claims or sorting through paperwork.
