"What obstacles threaten Florida agriculture's economic viability, and how do we address them?"









Rules and Information

Background Information

Each year, Florida Farm Bureau Federation's Women's Leadership Program sponsors a statewide Youth Speech Contest. The contest has three levels of competition: County, District, and State. The contest may also have two divisions, Senior and Intermediate, depending on the County and District. Please reach out to your County Farm Bureau office about the County and District contests available in your area. The winner of each county contest moves on to compete at the District level and the winner of each District goes on to the State contest at the FFBF Annual Meeting in October. There is currently no Intermediate Division at the State level.

The purpose of this contest is to promote a stronger interest and clearer understanding of the many aspects of agriculture, to provide opportunities for our youth to gain knowledge, appreciation, and understanding of agriculture, and help to promote agriculture's many values and virtues.

Qualifications

Senior Division - any student who is at least 14 years of age, and not over 18 years of age as of September 26, 2025 (not having reached their 19th birthday).

Intermediate Division - any student who is at least 11 years of age, and not over 13 years of age as of September 26, 2025 (not having reached their 14th birthday).

Students must be a resident in the County of the sponsoring County Farm Bureau.

Membership in the County Farm Bureau is not a requirement, however, it is encouraged. Contestants must display a positive attitude about agriculture and the speech content must be in line with Farm Bureau policies.



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Contest Format

Students must give a 5-minute speech on the specified topic. Each County Farm Bureau has discretion over their county contest but must follow the rules in this packet and their judges all use the same scoring rubric. County Farm Bureau's determine their own prizes. The winner of each County contest then moves on to compete at the District level. The Women's Leadership Committee member has discretion over the District contest but must follow the rules in this packet and the judges all use the same scoring rubric. The FFBF has designated prize money for the District and State level and there may be opportunity for additional prize money at the District level.

County and District Contests must be held prior to September 26, 2025. The FFBF State Office must receive the name of each Senior Division District winner, their application and a copy of their speech by 4:30pm on September 26, 2025, or the student will be ineligible for the State contest. Once the speech has been submitted to the state office, no changes can be made.

Senior Division District winners will then compete for the State award during Florida Farm Bureau Federation's Annual Meeting on October 28, 2025. The student must be present at the State contest in order to compete. If the District winner is not available to compete, Districts may substitute the second place District winner. If this occurs, the first place District winner will forfeit their title. Travel and lodging expenses to the State contest are the responsibility of the County Farm Bureau that they represent.



Rules and Information

Rules

- Senior Division competitors must be at least 14 years of age and not over 18 years of age on or before September 26, 2025.
- Intermediate Division competitors must be at least 11 years of age and not over 13 years of age on or before September 26, 2025.
- Competitors must be a resident of the County they are representing.
- Previous State winners are not eligible to compete again.
- The competitor must prepare and present the speech personally.
- The competitor is not permitted to use any visual aids such as a PowerPoint presentation or poster.
- Speeches for both divisions must be 5 minutes in length+/-30 seconds. Short/long speeches will face point deductions.
- Each judge will individually rank the participants and then rankings from all judges will be averaged to determine the final placings.
