## 2026 Youth Speech Contest

WOMEN'S LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

### ABOUT THE CONTEST:

Florida Farm Bureau Federation's Women's Leadership Program hosts an annual statewide Youth Speech Contest to encourage understanding and appreciation of agriculture.

### COMPETITION LEVELS:

- **County** → **District** → **State**
- Some counties/districts may offer Senior and Intermediate divisions. Contact your local County Farm Bureau for details.
- **State level:** Senior Division only.

### PURPOSE:

- Promote interest and knowledge of agriculture.
- Highlight agriculture's values and importance.

### ELIGIBILITY:

- **Senior Division:** Ages 14–18 (as of September 18, 2026; not 19).
- **Intermediate Division:** Ages 11–13 (as of September 18, 2026; not 14).
- Must reside in the sponsoring County.
- Farm Bureau membership not required but encouraged.
- Speech must align with Farm Bureau policies.

### CONTEST DETAILS:

- **2026 topic:**

What are some of the proactive, collaborative steps that farmers, ranchers, local communities, and organizations like Farm Bureau can take to help guard against invasive species threatening Florida agriculture?

”

- **Speech Length:** 5 minutes (+/- 30 seconds).
- No visual aids allowed.
- Judges use a standardized scoring rubric.

## DEADLINES:

- County & District contests: **Before September 20, 2026.**
- District winners (Senior Division): Submit application and speech to FFBF no later than **September 21, 2026, at 4:30 PM EST.**
- State contest: October 29, 2026 at 9am at FFBF Annual Meeting in Daytona. (County Farm Bureau covers one night hotel for District winner to attend state Annual Meeting. FFBF provides tickets for the State winner and two guests to the luncheon following the contest, where the winner will give their speech to all attendees).

## PRIZES:

- **County Level:** Determined by County Farm Bureau.
- **District Level:** Determined by District, minimum prizes are:
  - Senior: \$500
  - Intermediate: \$250
- **State Level (Senior Division only):**
  - Finalists: \$100 + plaque
  - 2nd Place: \$500 + plaque
  - Winner: \$1,000 + plaque



## RULES:

- Must meet age and residency requirements.
- Previous State winners cannot compete again.
- Online applications must be submitted by deadline for County competition
- Speech must be original and presented by the contestant.
- Application and a copy of the speech of the District winner must be submitted by the Women's District Chair or the District Field Representative to the state office to compete at the state level.
- Length violations result in point deductions.
- Contestants may use AI tools for research and idea generation, but the speech content must be written in their own words and reflect their personal understanding and perspective.
- To enhance the speakers' credibility and ensure that the focus remains entirely on the content of the speech, contestants must wear professional attire.
